THE COURT: Dulberg versus multiple  
defendants, Case No. 2022 L 010905.

MR. CHAPMAN: Good morning, your Honor.  
Robert Chapman for the petitioner ADR Systems.

THE COURT: Good morning.

Good morning, Mr. Dulberg.

MR. DULBERG: Good morning.

THE COURT: Good morning.

MR. DULBERG: Can you hear us?

THE COURT: Yes.

MR. DULBERG: Can you see us?

THE COURT: I can see you.

MR. DULBERG: Very good.

THE COURT: Okay.

Now, I'm not positive, because I haven't seen  
it, but our court coordinator did tell me: Is it  
true that, Mr. Dulberg, you have an attorney who is  
being going to be representing you to respond to  
the petition for fees? Is that right? Or any  
other things?

MR. DULBERG: No. We both -- we've already  
responded to the petition.

1 THE COURT: Okay. All right.

2 MR. DULBERG: On February 24th.

3 THE COURT: Okay. I thought I had seen or,  
4 you know, I thought I had seen something about  
5 there being a new attorney on this case somewhere,  
6 so I apologize if I'm misunderstanding who was  
7 popping in.

8 MR. BOEDER: Me.

9 THE COURT: Ah.

10 MR. BOEDER: I'm sorry. If I may, your Honor,  
11 Jeremy Boeder. I had represented the Dulberg --  
12 or, I'm sorry, the Baudin defendants in the past.  
13 I changed firms and we filed a --

14 THE COURT: Ah.

15 MR. BOEDER: (inaudible) motion for  
16 substitution. We're sort of hoping that that could  
17 get taken care of today. We do have a substitution  
18 of attorneys signed by the former firm, but I'm  
19 guessing that's what you saw --

20 THE COURT: Absolutely. Okay.

21 MR. BOEDER: -- (inaudible) yesterday.

22 THE COURT: Okay. So thank you for that. I  
23 knew it came in like right, you know, before I had  
24 a chance to really look. So, yes, that's

1 absolutely granted then.

2 MR. LONG: Judge, Thomas Long on behalf of  
3 Alphonse Talarico. And, by the way, Jeremy is  
4 never considered new; he's old.

5 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you for --

6 MR. LONG: I'm here on behalf of Mr. Talarico.

7 THE COURT: Okay. Fair enough. But let's  
8 see.

9 So Mr. Dulberg has already filed a response,  
10 but, Mr. Long, do you want to file a response on  
11 behalf of Mr. Talarico?

12 MR. LONG: No, Judge. We just want to move  
13 this along.

14 THE COURT: Okay. All right. Let's see.  
15 Anything else we need to do today other than I  
16 guess I can ask ADR: Do you want to file a reply  
17 to Mr. Dulberg's response?

18 MR. CHAPMAN: I'd like to avoid it, your  
19 Honor. It's --

20 THE COURT: Okay.

21 MR. CHAPMAN: It doesn't really address the  
22 issues of where we're at in the case right now,  
23 which is the fee petition that you've authorized us  
24 to.

1 THE COURT: Right.

2 MR. CHAPMAN: So then all I'd be doing is  
3 adding more costs onto our request. If there was a  
4 specific issue you wanted me to respond to, I  
5 would, but otherwise I don't think it's a good use  
6 of any of our time.

7 THE COURT: No. I understand. I just always  
8 ask when there's a pleading that somebody --

9 MR. CHAPMAN: Right.

10 THE COURT: -- at least technically has the  
11 right to file a written response to, I always ask  
12 if you want to. So that being said, you don't want  
13 to, here's what I'll do then.

14 Wait, let me ask: Is there anything else  
15 going on in this case right now other than that fee  
16 petition?

17 MR. CHAPMAN: No.

18 MR. KOST: May I -- may I go -- speak to that  
19 issue --

20 THE COURT: Sure.

21 MR. KOST: -- on this call?

22 THE COURT: Yes.

23 MR. KOST: Very good. In our February 24th of  
24 this year response, we alleged some, as everyone

1 would agree, some pretty, pretty serious claims we  
2 mentioned in front of the Court many times and we  
3 made the accusation of fraud on the Court that the  
4 sanctions were born in acts of fraud on the Court,  
5 and we would never, ever, ever say something like  
6 that in public or in court unless we had the  
7 exhibits to back it up, which is why we included  
8 the exhibits and we'll be glad to include more.

9 But, yes, these ac- -- we recognize, and I  
10 hope everyone else does, that it -- I've read  
11 somewhere that you should never use the "K" word in  
12 court, and I read that they meant kangaroo, because  
13 I, myself, can be sanctioned because it's just a  
14 serious thing to say and I recognize that, and I  
15 would never, ever go on record saying anything like  
16 this unless I had the evidence to back it up and  
17 quite a lot of it. So, yes, that is an issue  
18 that's been brought up and quite a few others.

19 There's -- there's --

20 THE COURT: Let me -- hold on. Hold on.

21 MR. KOST: Please.

22 THE COURT: When I asked the question, I  
23 wasn't meaning you. I know -- I've read quite a  
24 bit of what you've brought up, so I was wondering

1 what I'm -- what I'm considering right now is -- is  
2 bound to make me take into account everything that  
3 you have filed, everything that Mr. Dulberg has  
4 filed. So when I was asking if there was anything  
5 else out there, I do understand that your filings  
6 have something to do with your arguments that  
7 Mr. Dulberg should not be sanctioned and that, you  
8 know, he should have been allowed to proceed in  
9 other fashions that hadn't been permitted so far.  
10 So, yeah, I was just asking if anybody else had  
11 anything, not focusing on you versus ADR and all of  
12 Mr. Dulberg's pleadings as it is, so I wasn't  
13 asking. I know what you have, or at least I know  
14 what you've filed, so --

15 MR. KOST: There are -- there are other issues  
16 that just came up recently, if I may. I can show  
17 you --

18 THE COURT: No. Showing me here doesn't help  
19 because you have no idea just how small my screen  
20 is.

21 MR. KOST: Oh, I know. I'll gladly submit  
22 them to the court reporter, but it's very, very  
23 important because it has to do with --

24 THE COURT: No. No. Here's -- but here's

1 what you have to understand.

2 MR. KOST: Yes.

3 THE COURT: I consider things that have been  
4 filed.

5 MR. KOST: Okay.

6 THE COURT: So showing me stuff doesn't work.  
7 Sending me emails doesn't work. So you do know how  
8 to file things, so what I'll suggest that you do is  
9 if there's anything you think I need to consider  
10 that hasn't already been filed on the docket, file  
11 it in the docket of the case. Okay?

12 MR. KOST: I may file, say, a 15-page maximum  
13 for things I feel haven't already been mentioned,  
14 Judge.

15 THE COURT: Okay.

16 MR. KOST: Thank you.

17 THE COURT: Because what I was going to be  
18 doing anyway was taking some time to write an order  
19 on ADR's petition, and I understood that you had  
20 some things to say regarding the merits of the  
21 underlying allegations as well as the petition  
22 itself.

23 MR. KOST: That is correct.

24 THE COURT: (Inaudible due to crosstalk) But

1 we're granting sanctions itself, so, yes --

2 MR. LONG: Judge.

3 THE COURT: Yes. Who is speaking up?

4 Mr. Long, go ahead.

5 MR. LONG: My understanding is the case is  
6 over --

7 THE COURT: Yes.

8 MR. LONG: -- except for sanctions.

9 THE COURT: Yes.

10 MR. LONG: And now what Mr. Dulberg and  
11 company want to do is spin off into some other  
12 direction and I think that's entirely  
13 inappropriate.

14 THE COURT: Well, when we --

15 MR. LONG: There's no case left except  
16 sanctions.

17 THE COURT: Well, you heard me ask that  
18 question in exactly those terms, right?

19 MR. LONG: Yeah.

20 THE COURT: And so the deal is, I don't stop  
21 people from filing whatever it is they want to  
22 file, and to the extent that I think things have  
23 already been resolved and res judicata or a closed  
24 situation, I know there's been, you know, an appeal

1 dismissed on some of the, you know, underlying  
2 issues, so the push line is, particularly when  
3 someone is pro se, I'm not going to tell them to  
4 not file something, but if they file something that  
5 I think has already been foreclosed, that will be  
6 what goes into my order.

7 MR. LONG: Okay. Thanks, Judge. I just want  
8 to make sure we're all on the same page here and  
9 we're just not (inaudible) the case right now.

10 THE COURT: Well, if you remember the way I  
11 asked the question, I was asking, you know, anybody  
12 else got anything, and I knew that Mr. Dulberg had  
13 a bunch of other things to say, but, you know, I  
14 know where I think the case is. But, you know, I'm  
15 not going to say my mind is closed.

16 What I'm going to say is that I'm going to  
17 take everything into account, and if there are  
18 things that I think have been foreclosed, my order  
19 will reflect that.

20 So now as far as --

21 MR. KOST: May I -- excuse me, sir. May I  
22 add, sir, to what Thomas Long said? It will be  
23 very, very short, one second.

24 THE COURT: No. You don't need to. Like I

1 said, anything you think I need to consider you  
2 can --

3 MR. KOST: Yes.

4 THE COURT: -- add to the docket. Okay?

5 So --

6 MR. KOST: Yes. Absolutely. Thank you.

7 THE COURT: Okay. All-righty.

8 Now, with that said, I'm sure that you're not  
9 going to be taking long to put anything on the  
10 docket that you think I should read since you  
11 already have what you think I should read in your  
12 hand right now. So I'm going to presume -- let's  
13 see.

14 Mr. Chapman, are you going to -- I'm going to  
15 ask you to do the order since it's your petition  
16 today --

17 MR. CHAPMAN: Okay.

18 THE COURT: -- at issue now.

19 What I'm going to say is that I will presume  
20 that anything that anyone thinks I should consider  
21 will be filed by a week from tomorrow, so that's  
22 March 14th. Then I'm going to set this for a  
23 status.

24 Let's see. Darnesia, can I do a -- you've got

1 to tell me if I'm got some trial in the way. Can I  
2 set this for a status like any day during the week  
3 of April 14th? I'm sorry. I'm on trial that week.

4 THE CLERK: Yes, you are.

5 THE COURT: Oh, I am? Okay? How about the  
6 follow week, the 21st, the week of April 21? Am I  
7 on trial that week?

8 THE CLERK: You're trying to do a status?

9 THE COURT: Yeah. It can be an oddball time.

10 THE CLERK: Okay. April 22nd, that's a  
11 Tuesday, at 9.

12 THE COURT: Okay. So I'm going to set this  
13 for that date. So, Mr. Chapman, if you could just  
14 put in the ruling -- I mean in today's order that  
15 it's set for status April 22nd at 9 for status on  
16 the ruling on the fee petition and any other  
17 matters that Mr. Dulberg has submitted, and you can  
18 also put in the order that I anticipate having a  
19 ruling done before that date. Okay?

20 MR. CHAPMAN: We'll take care of that, your  
21 Honor.

22 THE COURT: Okay. All right.

23 MR. CHAPMAN: I think just from our end, your  
24 Honor, I emphasize this. You know, first of all,

1 Mr. Dulberg and Mr. Kost filed a 915-page document,  
2 which they did, that's fine, you know, whatever it  
3 is. It does -- just the -- my prayer for relief in  
4 my joint and several ruling is important to us and  
5 so that's the only point I want to add, so we'll  
6 prepare an order and circulate that.

7 THE COURT: Okay. All right. Thank you very  
8 much and thank everybody on this very much for your  
9 time and your patience. And, you know, if things  
10 go as I anticipate, if I issue a ruling that I  
11 think doesn't leave any need for me to actually see  
12 folks in person on that April date, I will, you  
13 know, I'll put that in the order. Okay.

14 MR. CHAPMAN: Thank you, your Honor.

15 MR. BOEDER: Excuse me, Judge. A housekeeping  
16 matter, your Honor, relative to the motion on our  
17 motion -- or, excuse me, the order on our motion  
18 for leave, we had already prepared a proposed  
19 order. Shall I just submit that one?

20 THE COURT: Yes. Absolutely.

21 MR. BOEDER: Thank you.

22 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you. All right.

23 Everybody have a good rest of your day.
