

1 THE COURT: Dulberg vs. Gagnon.

2 MR. ACARDO: Good morning, Your Honor. Perry
3 Acardo --

4 THE COURT: Good morning.

5 MR. ACARDO: -- on behalf of defendant.

6 MR. DULBERG: Good morning.

7 THE COURT: Okay. For the record, your name.

8 MR. DULBERG: Paul Dulberg.

9 MR. ACARDO: Judge, it's my understanding that
10 Randy Baudin's going to be coming in --

11 THE COURT: Okay.

12 MR. ACARDO: -- for the plaintiff. He should be
13 here this morning. So I don't know if you want to
14 pass it or --

15 THE COURT: All right. Let's pass.

16 MR. ACARDO: I have to go down to small claims
17 in 204 --

18 THE COURT: Okay. I will be here.

19 MR. ACARDO: -- if that's okay.

20 THE COURT: Okay. Yeah, we'll wait.

21 MR. ACARDO: Thank you, Judge.

22 (Whereupon, other matters were
23 heard and the afore-captioned
24 cause was recalled.)

1 THE COURT: What do you want to do?

2 MR. ACARDO: Maybe we can get ahold of them
3 or --

4 THE COURT: Is -- Mr. Baudin hasn't appeared, to
5 my knowledge.

6 MR. ACARDO: He has or he hasn't?

7 THE COURT: I -- I haven't seen anything.

8 MR. ACARDO: I know that he's -- I mean, I spoke
9 with him last week. He said he was planning on it.

10 THE COURT: Okay. Well --

11 MR. ACARDO: So...

12 THE COURT: -- I mean, do you want to wait and
13 see or...

14 MR. ACARDO: It seems strange that he's not
15 (indiscernible) right now.

16 THE COURT: Yeah. So I'm wondering if he's --
17 since he hasn't appeared, if he's intending to show.
18 I don't know.

19 MR. ACARDO: I don't know either.

20 THE COURT: If I continue it -- Mr. Dulberg, if
21 you could approach.

22 MR. DULBERG: I spoke with him last night.

23 THE COURT: I'm sorry.

24 MR. DULBERG: I spoke with him last night. He

1 was going to show up today (indiscernible).

2 THE COURT: Well, there's a limit to how long
3 I'll make attorneys wait, because he should be here
4 by 9:30. I'm watching. Somebody's here, but I
5 don't think that's Mr. Baudin.

6 MR. DULBERG: No.

7 THE COURT: Okay. I can continue to wait; I can
8 put it out a couple of weeks.

9 MR. ACARDO: I prefer to come back in a couple
10 weeks if that's fine.

11 THE COURT: All right. Is there a date that
12 works for you to come back?

13 MR. ACARDO: November 6th?

14 THE COURT: Okay. Mr. Dulberg, how does that
15 work for you?

16 MR. DULBERG: That's fine.

17 THE COURT: All right. I'll put it out for
18 status --

19 MR. ACARDO: Okay.

20 THE COURT: -- until then.

21 MR. ACARDO: It's up for a trial setting --

22 THE COURT: Setting for trial, and we'll see if
23 Mr. Baudin shows.

24 MR. ACARDO: All right.
